My Cancer Cover Amounts

Maximum cover of R500 000 with increments of R100 000.

Minimum Monthly Premium

The minimum premium is R100 per month. Note that the maximum cover amount of R500 000 may be increased (at the sole discretion of the underwriter) in certain circumstances to ensure that the minimum monthly premium is reached.

Minimum Entry Age: 19 Age Next Birthday

Maximum Entry Age: 65 Age Next Birthday

Cover Cease Age: Whole Life










Survival Period

14 Days from the date the contractual claim event definition has been met. This means that if a client is diagnosed with cancer which triggers a covered cancer claim event, but the client passes away within 14 days from diagnosis, no claim will be payable.

The survival period is applicable to prevent anti-selection.
